During her pupillage she assisted in an appeal to the Privy Council concerning the offence of scandalising the judiciary in Mauritius, and appeared in court in a number of immigration appeals. Before joining Chambers, Julia spent time working in the Department for Legal Affairs and Human Rights at the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe, where she gained considerable expertise concerning the implementation of the ECHR and co-authored a chapter concerning the role of the Parliamentary Assembly of the Council of Europe in ensuring Member States' compliance with the ECHR in the Hart publication ['Parliaments and Human Rights: Redressing the Democratic Deficit'](#). Julia also spent time as a Volunteer Attorney at the California Appellate Project, where she assisted with the Habeas Corpus appeals of indigent defendants facing the death penalty in California.

Julia has a strong interest in cases with an international element, having studied in France and worked in France and the USA.

Julia is willing to undertake cases pro bono where appropriate.
